Hello,

This letter is to assist you in using BOS Jadvantage in order to get to the AS/400 via your internet browser. If you are using Microsoft Internet Explorer, you should be at version 4.0.1 at the very least, and Netscape browsers should at be a minimum version of 4.08. This is true for both Windows 95 and 98. Note: America Online users have had some initial difficulty connecting, however most have been successful.

BOS Jadvantage Java applets will be loaded to the browser. You may get a message that Jadvantage components are about to be loaded - simply accept or grant license agreement terms if prompted. Depending on the speed of your internet connection; 56K modem, high speed DSL, or even cable access, a log in screen should appear. This may take some time to load initially, but try and be patient while the commands are through executing. If your log in screen is not appearing in a reasonable amount of time, please contact myself or the IS department help line.

When the log in screen finishes loading, book-mark this page (*i.e. add it to your "favorites"*). When logging in, you will be using your AS/400 user ID as both the user id and password for Jadvantage.

*Note; use your AS/400 password once you get to the green screen.

Click Log in Now. A display session name should appear in the box.

Click the Start button and in a few moments you should get a regular AS/400 sign on (green screen). I have mapped out the keyboards for all Jadvantage users so that the Enter key is the enter key, and the Ctrl key below the Enter key is the Field Exit key. Use the Esc key to access the mini menu.

That's it! Just remember to sign off the green screen when you are through, and close Jadvantage by clicking Session (*found in the upper left corner of the Jadvantage task bar*), and Exit. You can close your browser, to leave it open to go to other favorites, or log back in if you want. As long as you remember to sign off of the green screen, you can't really hurt anything.

When signed into the AS/400 from home, and you are going to be away from your desk for more than a few minutes, it is a good idea to sign off of the AS/400 green screen. The AS/400 active session has a tendency to disconnect if there is no activity. This tendency to disconnect has everything to do with what kind of internet access you have, and the amount of traffic on it.
